On February 5th, California dog owner Frank Lucido filed a classaction lawsuit against Purina, mak-

er of the popular dog food Beneful. Lucido claims that of his three dogs, Beneful killed one and made two very ill. According to the suit, Beneful contains propylene glycol, an ingredient found in automobile antifreeze. Purina says this ingredient is FDA-approved and is an additive used in human food products.

But Lucido says he's not the only victim. He claims that in

the past four years, there have been more than 3,000 online complaints regarding dog illnesses associated with the consumption of Beneful. Reported symptoms include stomach and related internal bleeding, liver malfunction or failure, vomiting, diarrhea, dehydration, weight loss, seizures and kidney failure.

Your dog may be a lot smarter than you think. The average dog is as linguistically intelligent as a two-year-old human. According to Stanley Coren, a professor and leading canine intelligence expert at the University of British

Columbia in Vancouver, dogs can understand about 165 words, signs and signals. The more intelligent dogs that Professor Coren studied understood up to as many as 250 words and signals, making them about as smart as a two-and-a-half year old human. 

6 Simple Steps to the Perfect Pedicure

- Find a well-lit area. Use trimmers designed for pet use only, ensuring they're sharp!
- Start with the front paws, holding the paw firmly in your hand. Push down on the top of the toe gently, making the nail stick
- Start at the tip of the nail, trim-



- Don't forget the dewclaws, if they haven't been removed, located on the inside of the leg, near the ankle.
- When you've finished trimming all the nails on all four paws, use a file to smooth out each nail.
- Praise your dog and reward him with a jackpot of treats.
